BACKGROUND

The Ambassador Bernard Andrew Kaigama (ABAK) Peace Foundation was established out of a deep commitment to addressing the complex humanitarian. social, and developmental crises in conflict-affected communities.

Northern Nigeria, for decades, has been plagued by ethno-religious violence, farmer-herder clashes, terrorism, banditry, political instability, poverty, and large-scale displacement. These challenges have led to:

- 1. Loss of countless lives and destruction of property.
- 2. Massive displacement and growth of internally displaced persons (IDPs).
- 3. Breakdown of trust and social cohesion.
- 4. High rates of illiteracy and school dropouts, especially among girls.
- 5. Limited access to healthcare, clean water, and basic infrastructure.
- 6. Widespread unemployment, especially among youth.

Despite being home to two major faiths, Christianity and Islam, both of which uphold peace as a core value, Northern Nigeria has continued to face deep-seated challenges.

These include entrenched mistrust between communities, the persistence of harmful stereotypes, and the absence of sustainable peace-building structures. Over the years, these issues have contributed to cycles of misunderstanding, tension, and in some cases, violence, affecting not only security but also social and economic development in the region.

In response to these pressing realities, **Pst. Amb. Bernard Andrew Kaigama**, a United Nations Positive Livelihood Award Centre (UN-POLAC) Ambassador for Peace, envisioned an initiative that would go beyond dialogue to deliver practical, sustainable solutions for unity and development.

Inspired by a shared vision among peace advocates, he collaborated with other like-minded leaders to bring this dream to life.

The **ABAK Peace Foundation** was thus co-founded by a dedicated network of passionate individuals, notably **Pst. Amb. Bernard Andrew Kaigama** and **Amb. Ishaya Adamu**, a respected voice for equity, justice, and social stability.

Together, they sought to create a platform that addresses the root causes of division, promotes inclusivity, and builds resilient communities through peace education, humanitarian outreach, and capacity-building programs. to restore peace, rebuild livelihoods, empower the vulnerable, and promote inclusive development.

Their combined leadership, driven by conviction and experience, continues to position the Foundation as a beacon of hope, proving that peace is not merely the absence of conflict but the presence of fairness, understanding, and shared progress.

Initially focused on Northern Nigeria, the Foundation's work has grown in impact and demand, leading to expansion across Nigeria and into the African subregion, adapting its peace building and development strategies to diverse cultural and conflict contexts.



Cross-Border Pastoralism, Environmental Change, and Peacebuilding In Collaboration with Conciliation Resources | Supported by UK Aid

In line with our mission to promote sustainable peace and strengthen community resilience, the ABAK-PEACE FOUNDATION was privileged to serve as a research partner in a landmark cross-border initiative titled "Cross-Border Pastoralism, Environmental Change, and Peacebuilding in Adamawa State and Cameroon."

This impactful engagement was hosted by Conciliation Resources and supported by UK Aid, under the XCEPT (Cross-Border Conflict, Evidence, Policy and Trends) Programme. The culmination of the research was marked by a multi-stakeholder validation event held on May 17, 2023, at the American University of Nigeria's Yola Hotel.

Purpose of the Research

The research was initiated to:

- Understand the conflict dynamics linked to pastoral mobility, climate change, and competition over natural resources.
- Examine the environmental and security challenges affecting herder–farmer relations across borders.
- Promote inclusive peacebuilding strategies rooted in local realities and cultural understanding.

Stakeholder Engagement

The forum brought together a wide range of actors including:

- Herders' and farmers' associations
- Traditional rulers and religious leaders
- Security agencies
- Government officials from both Nigeria and Cameroon
- Civil society groups and development stakeholders

This inclusive approach ensured that the findings reflected diverse perspectives, lived experiences, and practical solutions.

- Implementing sustainable resource management practices.
- Exploring economic diversification opportunities to reduce competition over dwindling resources.
- Strengthening cross-border cooperation as a foundation for lasting peace and stability.

ABAK Peace Foundation Hosts Distinguished Conference on Post-Electoral Peace in Nigeria

OVERVIEW

On September 21st, 2023, in commemoration of World Peace Day, the ABAK Peace Foundation convened a distinguished conference themed: "Post-Electoral Peace and Peaceful Coexistence in Nigeria: A Prerequisite for National Development."

The event, held at the prestigious Murtala Nyako Multipurpose Hall within the State Secretariat Complex, Adamawa State, attracted eminent personalities, including the official representative of the Executive Governor of Adamawa State, Rt. Hon. Ahmadu Umaru Fintiri, alongside traditional rulers, community leaders, security agencies, policymakers, religious leaders, civil society representatives, and other key stakeholders from across the state.

Why This Conference Was Necessary

In Nigeria, electoral cycles are often marked by violence before, during, and after elections manifesting in clashes between political supporters, destruction of property, inflammatory rhetoric, and in some cases, loss of lives. These tensions are fueled by:

Mistrust in electoral processes and perceptions of injustice in results.

Politicization of ethnicity and religion, deepening societal divisions.

Winner-takes-all politics, where losing parties feel completely excluded from governance.

Weak conflict resolution mechanisms at both community and institutional levels.

Recognizing this recurring pattern, ABAK Peace Foundation organized this conference to break the cycle of electoral violence and promote a culture of peaceful political engagement.

Strategic Choice for Lasting Impact

Rather than organizing rallies or street demonstrations, the Foundation deliberately chose a conference format to provide a platform for informed dialogue, evidence-based discussion, and collaborative engagement.

This approach reflected our belief that peace is best nurtured through intellectual exchange, critical reflection, and consensus-building. By gathering experts, practitioners, and decision-makers in one space, the conference enabled meaningful conversations that addressed the root causes of post-electoral tensions while offering practical solutions for long-term unity.

Key Discussion Topics

The conference featured expert presentations and thought-provoking sessions, including:

- 1. The 2023 Elections Pronouncements vs. Perceptions, Actions vs. Innuendos: A critical review of matters arising, with a focus on Adamawa State
- 2. Mismanagement of Electoral Victory The Bane of Nigeria's Democracy: Lessons from Adamawa State.
- 3. Subjectivity and the Religionization of Elections in Nigeria: Challenges and solutions in Adamawa State's context.
- 4. Objectively Managing Victory The Anatomy of Peace and Peaceful Coexistence: Practical strategies for building unity post-elections.

ABAK PEACE FOUNDATION'S PARTICIPATION AT THE 5TH LAKE CHAD BASIN GOVERNORS' FORUM

In a significant stride toward strengthening regional peace and development, ABAK Peace Foundation was honored as one of the three organizations selected from Adamawa State to participate in the 5th Lake Chad Basin Governors' Forum, a high-level strategic meeting convened to address the multidimensional challenges facing the Lake Chad region.

Held under the theme of regional cooperation, peace, and sustainable development, the forum brought together governors from Cameroon, Chad, Niger, and Nigeria, alongside international development partners and civil society organizations. The discussions focused on shared strategies to address security threats, foster social cohesion, and drive long-term development across the region.

MENSTRUAL HYGIENE DAY

OUTREACH - MAY 28, 2025

Together for a period friendly world...

As part of its ongoing commitment to health, dignity, and gender equality, the ABAK Peace Foundation commemorated the World Menstrual Hygiene Day on May 28, 2025, with a strategic outreach to Aliyu Mustafa College, Yola Town. This activity targeted adolescent girls with the aim of breaking the silence and stigma surrounding menstruation, while promoting menstrual health and personal hygiene.

The outreach focused on raising awareness, providing education, and supporting menstrual hygiene management (MHM) among schoolgirls. Through an interactive health session led by professionals, the students were taught about the biological realities of menstruation, hygiene best practices, and the importance of managing menstruation with dignity and confidence.

In furtherance of its humanitarian mandate, the Foundation distributed essential hygiene kits to the girls, which included:

- 1. Sanitary pads
- 2. Soap
- 3. Detergent
- 4. Underwear

This intervention was both timely and impactful, addressing several challenges commonly associated with poor menstrual hygiene, such as:

- 1. School absenteeism
- 2. Increased vulnerability to infections
- 3. Low self-esteem and psychological distress
- 4. Social exclusion due to entrenched cultural taboos

The outreach aligns with the Foundation's Health and Nutrition, Education, and Protection pillars, and serves as a practical step toward achieving gender equity and inclusive development in Northern Nigeria.

Key Challenges Identified:

- 1. Limited awareness and education on reproductive health
- 2. Inadequate access to sanitary materials among disadvantaged girls
- 3. Persistent cultural taboos discouraging open conversations
- 4. Infrastructural gaps in school WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) facilities

The Way Forward

ABAK Peace Foundation is committed to:

- 1. Expanding menstrual hygiene awareness campaigns to other schools and rural areas
- 2. Partnering with public and private stakeholders to improve menstrual health education
- 3. Advocating for inclusive school infrastructure and sustainable hygiene product access

This activity is one of the many ways the ABAK Peace Foundation continues to demonstrate its vision of building a peaceful and progressive society where every girl is equipped with the knowledge, confidence, and resources to thrive.
